



## Frequently Asked Questions

Where are we able to store our personal items?

The Aquatic Park has lockers available for no charge in our changing rooms. Personal items may also be brought poolside.

What forms of payment are accepted?

We accept cash, check (made payable to the City of Fairmont – Aquatic Park), and Visa or Mastercard.

Can food and beverage be brought into the facility?

The Park does not allow outside food or beverage, with the exception of baby bottles and water, into the Park. The Park has a wide variety of food and beverage items available for purchase at the concession stand.

Once I enter the Park, can I leave and re-enter later?

Yes. Before you leave, get your hand stamped at the front desk so you can re-enter at a later time that day.

Do I have to pay if I decide not to swim?

All persons entering the Park, including spectators are required to pay the daily admission rate.

How old do I have to be to use the super slides?

Individuals must be 48 inches all to ride the slides. Only one rider down the sliders at a time. There is a smaller slide available for younger children in the zero-depth pool.

Flotation devices are not allowed at the Aquatic Park. Why?

Examples of flotation devices include: beach balls, water wings, life jackets, fun noodles, etc. Flotation devices are not permitted for the following reasons:

- Flotation devices are not life preservers
- They can promote overconfidence in poor swimmers
- They encourage the care provider to pay less attention to their swimmer(s)
- Poor swimmers are more likely to swim in deep water where trouble could occur more rapidly
- Many flotation devices hold children in an incorrect position, which could cause the child to easily tip over
- Many flotation devices are made of plastic that could easily pop or deflate
- Flotation devices clog the pool and encourage horseplay

When was the Aquatic Park constructed and who were the pool designers?

The Park was completed in July 1999. General contractors were Global Specialties and Pool Design Contractors was US Aquatics.
